CHEA Scouting by Jim Warrick, Scouting Chairman

Statistics reflect overwhelming support for Scouting as a program for youth from Lodges in the Association. In 2007-2008, Lodges donated over \$100,000 to various Scouting groups, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Sea Scouts, and Cub Scouts. Elk volunteers also drove over 50,000 miles and donated over 15.000 hours to more than 5.000 Scouts in California and Hawaii.

Lodges lent their facilities and members applauded the character building of over 150 Lodge sponsored Eagle Scouts and 50 Gold Award Scouts. In 2007, CHEA also recognized Eagle Scouts Russell Furry and Danny Sackett as winners in the CHEA Eagle Scout Essay contest and helped send Scouts Cole Berber and Cameron Roth to the 100th Anniversary of Scouting.

Elks applaud Scouting as a way to teach young people citizenship and moral character. The Elks strong support for Scouting stands as a responsible promotion of positive youthful achievement. In 2008-2009, CHEA will again feature the Eagle Scout/ Gold Award Essay Contest. In 2008-2009, the Scouting Committee is also seeking 100% participation in the Scouting Program in the California-Hawaii Elks Association. The Boy Scout and Girl Scout movements are one of the best deterrents to drug related problems we may offer our young people in America.




Member Receives Special Citation


Sculpture Donated to Reno Lodge

Rancho Cordova Elks Make \$10,000 Grant Stretch to Help Many People

The Elks National Foundation awarded the Rancho Cordova Elks Lodge a \$10,000 Impact Grant for their Catch The Spirit (CTS) Project to provide assistance to veterans and military families in Northern California, and to other families in need in the community. In 2006, the CTS Project provided Christmas toys and food baskets to 700 military families and 250 needy families in the local community at Christmas. The food consisted of a turkey and six boxes of canned and fresh food. The National Guard, the Army Reserves and the Rancho Cordova Police Department distributed the food.

For the 2007 Christmas Holiday season, the Impact Grant, along with donations from many businesses and individuals, helped the CTS Project provide over 900 Northern California military families and at least 300 local Rancho Cordova families with at least three boxes of food and toys during the 2007 Christmas holiday season.

In addition to the Christmas time deliveries, the Grant will allow the CTS Project to continue to provide assistance throughout the year to veterans, military families and others as needed. Since December of 2007, the Project has distributed 928 turkeys, 928 cases of pastries, 4,000 loaves of bread, 1,000 containers of assorted milk, 500 cartons of juice, 1,000 toys, 120 bicycles, 6 pallets of candy, 10 pallets of ice cream, 36 pallets of pastry, 500 cases of dairy products, 15 pallets of bread, 10,000 children's greeting cards for deployed members to send to their children back home, and 20 pieces of donated furniture to military families in need.

The CTS Project will also provide clothes, sundries, snacks, soda water, and other supplies to about 150 injured veterans and their families transiting through Travis Air Force Base and to 40 injured veterans at the Veterans Home in Yountville, California.

In effect, the CTS Project Manager has become a "dispatcher/facilitator", fielding calls from military, veterans and community service organizations about special needs for families in the area. If he cannot meet those needs from existing donations, he contacts various businesses and food distributors for donations to meet those needs.

The success of the CTS Project has largely depended on the generous donations of food, equipment and warehouse space from local businesses. The Elks National Foundation Impact Grant will go a long way in helping to meet those needs that cannot be satisfied through other donations.
